

Position Title: Development Intern Reports To: Executive Director

Position Summary: AR Kids Read is pleased to offer an internship for candidates interested in fundraising, development and nonprofit-oriented careers. Applications will be accepted from current students in their senior year, recent undergraduates (4-year program), and graduate students.

This is a hands-on internship where you will engage in the development priorities of the organization. You will attend meetings with organization staff and sponsors, participate in fundraising events, and build experience in grant writing and donor communications.

The ideal candidate enjoys relationship building, has experience working with special events, and demonstrates strong written and verbal communication skills. Among other tasks, the intern will research funders and philanthropic trends, assist in editing and writing foundation and donor reports and correspondence, help maintain and improve information systems, and provide support to AKR's growing individual donor and grants management programs.

The candidate must be interested in working with a team to develop and support the mission of AR Kids Read. AKR is fast-paced, and a can-do attitude is essential. The internship is a great opportunity to gain real-world professional experience while impacting the lives of Arkansas' youngest citizens.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Commitment of 12 hours per week for the year-long internship (holidays and vacation time will be pre-scheduled and mutually agreed upon)
- Assist in the development and review of grant proposals, budgets and supplemental application materials
- Foster donor relationships and raise awareness for AKR program
- Coordinate productions and mailing of spring and year-end appeal letters
- Manage details associated with fundraising and development events
- Organize volunteer events in collaboration with Program team
- Prepare media materials for distribution. (i.e. copying, filing, mailing, e-mailing)
- Assemble media, presentations and donor kits for events and meetings
- Conduct preliminary research on prospective corporate, foundation and individual donors
- Maintain foundation, corporate and individual donor files (on Salesforce)
- Other Duties, as assigned
